### Primary Age or Early Secondary Age Activity

#### You will need

- A4 or A3 paper enough paper for all learners
- Pencils/colouring pens/paints
- Recycled materials for decoration (optional)

#### What to do

# Step 1: Introduce the theme for Anti-Bullying Week 2024 - 'Respect - What does it mean to you?'

Respect is fundamental in all healthy relationships. It should be at the heart of how we treat each other. Everyone has a right to live free from bullying and harassment. When we behave respectfully towards each other, we help create environments where bullying cannot thrive, and children and young people's rights are fully realised.

Respect is a word we use often. This Anti-Bullying Week, we want to explore the role it plays in our lives and relationships. For instance:

- What examples of respect do you see on a daily basis?
- What does disrespect look like?
- How can we demonstrate and model self-respect?
- Who can help us be more respectful?
- How do we help people recognise disrespect and its impacts?

Step 2: Invite learners to design a poster for Anti-Bullying Week 2024.

This can be for their school, class or group.

- The date of Anti-Bullying Week (11-15 November 2024)
- Individual response to what respect means
- Reference to school's own values / or anti-bullying policy
- The respectme logo/Anti-Bullying Week campaign logo and school logo
- The learner's school, class, or group name
- A colourful and eye-catching design
